Thrift Store Announcements

The Thrift Store needs clothing, linens, and blankets. The store is always in need of decorative household items, dishes, accessories, whatnots, etc.— these items sell quickly.

Members are reminded that donations of garments and household items (furniture and bedding too) are also

needed. Garments can be in *ANY condition* because income is also derived from *rag sales*.

A recycling source from Clinton has been located for computers, televisions, all electronics, anything metal including wire coat hangers. They picked up one load last Thursday and are waiting on us for more stuff. They are going to install a large trailer at the back of the thrift store for storage in between pickups and will build a fence around it ASAP. They also take broken unusable furniture and strip it down for the metal framing in it. They are paying us going rate per lb (which changes weekly) for junk and hauling if off at their expense. It is a win-win situation for everyone; they make money, we make money and it keeps stuff out of the landfill. Of course anything donated that is workable will be sold in thrift store. All donations are welcome. (The value of your donation is tax deductible and a receipt will be provided by store staff.) Be sure to tell your friends and neighbors! For pickups, call 601-636-2769.
