President's Message

Greetings,

We are already a week into the shortest month of the year and kicking off our first fund raiser of the year. Affairs of the Heart VII will be held on the 17th and 18th February at 7:00 PM at the Vicksburg Theater Guild. Your help is needed! Please come out, see the performances and thank the volunteers who donate their time and talent to this production. If you're not able to attend, please purchase a ticket(s), donate refreshments for the concession stand, and/or make a monetary donation.

Celebrating black history as a month-long educational theme has been observed since 1976 in the United States. It is a time to commemorate the achievements and contributions of African Americans. As the country grapples with issues of racial inequality and unrest, the increasing awareness of the country's racial history can reduce hostility by providing Americans with a better understanding of current movements, says Gerald Horne, a professor of history and African American studies at the University of Recognizing and discussing the past is a crucial step toward future reconciliation.



This February marks the first Black History Month for the National Museum of African American History and Culture in Washington, D.C., which opened in September and features relics ranging from ballast bars found aboard a Portuguese slave ship that sunk in 1794 to the Chicago Bulls jersey worn by Michael Jordan during the 1996-1997 season playoffs. Horne describes the museum, owned by the Smithsonian Institution, as a "huge step forward" – one that would not have

been possible without Black History Month.

On February 14th, many people will exchange cards, candy, gifts or flowers with their special 'valentine;' let's focus on how we treat others.

What God Has to Say About Why We Volunteer
