What We Believe

The Salvation Army's eleven articles of faith reflect our determination to remain faithful to our standards and principles.

- 1. We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and that they only constitute the Divine rule of Christian faith and practice.
- 2. We believe that there is only one God, who is infinitely perfect, the Creator, Preserver, and Governor of all things, and who is the only proper object of religious worship.
- 3. We believe that there are three persons in the Godhead the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, undivided in essence and co-equal in power and glory.
- 4. We believe that in the person of Jesus Christ the Divine and human natures are united, so that He is truly and properly God and truly and properly man.
- 5. We believe that our first parents were created in a state of innocence, but by their disobedience, they lost their purity and happiness, and that in consequence of their fall, all men have become sinners, totally depraved, and as such are justly exposed to the wrath of God.
- 6. We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ has by His suffering and death made an atonement for the whole world so that whosoever will may be saved.
- 7. We believe that repentance toward God, faith in our Lord Jesus Christ and regeneration by the

Holy Spirit are necessary to salvation.

- 8. We believe that we are justified by grace through faith in our Lord Jesus Christ and that he that believeth hath the witness in himself.
- 9. We believe that continuance in a state of salvation depends upon continued obedient faith in

Christ

10. We believe that it is the privilege of all believers to be wholly sanctified, and that their whole spirit and soul and body may be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Welcome Major Steve and Major Mary Welch

We are delighted to welcome our new officers Majors Steve and Mary Welch. Here is a biographical sketch provided so that we can get to know more about them and their family.

Major Steve Welch, one of four Salvation Army officer children of Majors Jeffery L. (Promoted to Glory) and Shirley M. Welch (R) of Ludington, Michigan, lived in several western Michigan and northern Indiana cities

and graduated from North Side High School in Fort Wayne, Indiana. Upon completing a Bachelor of Music Education program at Indiana University (Fort Wayne campus), Major Steve met his bride-to-be, Major Mary, at The Salvation Army's Southern Territorial School of Music at Camp Keystone, Florida.

Major Mary Welch grew up in Lynn Haven, Florida and graduated from Mosley High School. Her first contact with The Salvation Army came at the age of 14 and resulted from an invitation from her grandmother to attend a Ladies' Home League meeting. Major Mary was soon involved in other Salvation Army programs and came to understand that God was calling her to officership in the "Army".

The Welches were married at The Salvation Army, Melbourne, Florida Corps in 1978 and entered the School for Officers Training in Atlanta that Fall. In June, 1980, they were commissioned (ordained) Lieutenants by General Arnold Brown at the National Congress in Kansas City. Since then, they have held appointments in Jacksonville and Orange Park in Florida; Chickasha, McAlester, and Shawnee in Oklahoma; Gainesville, Sebring, Pensacola, and Key West in Florida, Meridian, Mississippi, and most recently Selma, Alabama.

Each of the Welches' three children was born in a different state. Rebekah, born in East Point, Georgia, graduated from Gainesville High School and the University of South Florida, taught school in Lake Placid, Florida, and completed officer training at the School for Officer Training at The Salvation Army Evangeline Booth College in Atlanta. She and her husband, Major Phil Swyers, are stationed in Savannah, Georgia. They are the parents of five of the Welches' grandchildren. Bethany was born in Orange Park, Florida and graduated from Trevecca Nazarene University. She and her husband, Tim Delaney are Salvation Army officers serving in Hickory, North Carolina and are the parents of three grandchildren. Christopher was born in Chickasha, Oklahoma. He graduated from Sebring High School and Florida Southern College. After teaching elementary music in Winter Haven, he became the Assistant Music Director for the Florida Division of The Salvation Army. He and his Italian wife, Jessica, are now Salvation Army officers stationed in Torre Pellice, Italy.
