Our theme for the November meeting is "Thanksgiving." Many thanks to Wanda Clark and Trudy James for serving as November meeting hostesses.


Members are asked to bring one (or more) of the following items for use in the Client Pantry for food bags that are distributed weekly to those in need.



Member Snapshots


