From the President's Desk

Treasures in an Old Box



I peeked into the box. File folders, plastic bags filled with yellowed newspaper clippings, a scrapbook with pages hardened and brittle with time, and photos darkened and fragile -- that's what was in the "found" box. It had been "lost," or at least not available, for quite a few years. As I took out its contents, I realized the old box was indeed a "treasure box". For this was a box full of history. Not a complete history, but glimpses of the birthing of a new organization formed by women with a desire to serve the needs of their community. The clippings, photos, and letters document the beginning of the Salvation Army Women's Auxiliary in Vicksburg, Mississippi. By following the details of the letters and newspaper articles, it is evident that when Mrs. Major Sam Crowder suggested the formation of a Women's Auxiliary to aid in the work of the Salvation Army, the community joined in with enthusiasm. The organizational meeting was held on September 27, 1976 at the Citadel, which was on Locust St. in the Duff Green Mansion. From that date on, it seems that the women of the Salvation Army Auxiliary have never stopped.

Thirty ladies formed that first group. After only a couple of months, they held a membership tea in the Mansion and displayed more than 300 dolls which had been purchased by the Salvation Army, and then dressed in beautiful outfits by ladies of Vicksburg. These dolls were distributed during the Christmas season to families along with food baskets. That 1976 "doll show" began the event which eventually became the "Doll Auction" held in conjunction with the yearly Soup & Sandwich Lunch. Through the years, the simple dolls of 1976 became elegantly dressed beauties in handmade dresses which were auctioned to an eager public, ending in 2002.

The founding members, who worked to establish this Auxiliary Chapter, may not have realized the enduring effect their efforts would have on this community. They may not have realized that the example they set would inspire hundreds of other women to serve in the same way. They probably did have, though, the vision of the thousands of men, women, and children who would be helped physically, economically, and spiritually through the work of the Salvation Army and the volunteers of the Auxiliary.

Looking through the "Treasure Box" and some files of "treasured members" has opened my eyes to the rich history and the inspiring

legacy we have. The record of service and dedication of 33 years is amazing. Just think of the thousands of families aided, the children who had toys on Christmas, the elderly who were visited, the stranded travelers, the abandoned, the hungry, the disaster victims, the destitute, and indeed the lost souls, who have not only had physical needs met, but spiritual as well.

Fundraising efforts have evolved over these 33 years. The Annual Soup & Sandwich Fundraiser has grown from the small lunch cooked and served at the Citadel to the 600+ being served today. The Bake Sale has always been a part of the S&S event it seems, but grows bigger each year. In 2002, the Silent Auction was added to the S&S list of events and has grown in size and popularity each year.

The Vicksburg Historical Christmas Ornament Project began in 1989 with the sale of the first ornament which depicted the Old Court House Museum, Planters Hall and the MS River Bridges. New designs were produced every year from 1989 - 2006 (15 different ornaments). This was a labor intensive project, but proved to be not only a successful fundraiser, but created public awareness of the mission and programs of the Auxiliary and the Salvation Army.

More recent additions to the fundraising efforts such as the Spring Luau (2007 & 2008) and the "Soles for Souls" project evidence the inventive and progress oriented modern SAWA.

I hope that we can save the bits of the Auxiliary history that we have, restore some of the damaged photos, secure other documents, and archive them safely.

The October Soup & Sandwich Event is the 30th such fundraiser for the Vicksburg SAWA. Several of our present members have been involved in this project for many years. There are two I want to mention here and the others to recognize at the October meeting. "Miss Gladys" Bingham has been strictly supervising (and taste testing) the soup preparation for more years than she can remember – estimate 25 years! "Miss Dot" Steen has been the master chef of the pimento cheese for 30 years according to my sources. Now if those ladies' dedication does not inspire us...what will?

Now, inspired by our predecessors, let's continue their legacy and make this S&S the biggest, the best, in order to "Serve Up Hope" to increasing numbers of people who need it.
