President's Message

Happy October,

It's a busy time as we prepare for our annual fundraising event, the 38th Soup and Sandwich Luncheon, Silent Auction/Bake Sale. It's also a time when we are in full swing with our Corps programs: Angel Tree and the Red Kettle Campaign. More volunteers are always welcome!

October is a month of change. It's already autumn, but we haven't started to feel its effects yet. Soon the trees will start to shed their green clothing for coats of many colors, so to speak. So, we too are to change — our hearts! God's expectation is that those who serve and worship Him must have hearts that are rightly related to Him (Deuteronomy 26:16; 1 Samuel 7:3).

Ezekiel 36 records God's promise to give Israel a new heart so that their relationship might be spiritually renewed. An intimate and meaningful relationship with Him requires more than the outward obedience to religious ritual. It requires an inward change of the motives and tendencies to please Him and minister for Him. God's concern is with our hearts. The hatred and prejudice that abound today cannot be legislated or discussed away. What is needed is a change of the heart that only God can give through the ministry of the Holy Spirit (Faith Pathway).

"A new heart also will I give you, and a new spirit will I put within you: and I will take away the stony heart out of your flesh, and I will give you a heart of flesh. And I will put My Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in My Statutes, and ye shall keep My Judgments, and do them... Without Me ye can do nothing" (Ezekiel 36:26-27; John 15:5).

October is also Breast Cancer Awareness month, which is an annual campaign to increase awareness of the disease. Get your mammogram!!

October Meeting Theme: Fire Up for Fall!


