

Soup & Sandwich Luncheon

"Serving Up Hope" is once again the theme of our 31st Soup & Sandwich Luncheon. Last year our Auxiliary members and other volunteers stepped up to the plate, took on the challenge of making more soup than ever, collecting more Silent Auction items than ever, and generally working harder than ever. AND what a success that event was. Our goal was \$10,000. Raising \$12,483 was more than we dared pray for or imagine. But the Lord "... is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us," *Ephesians 3:19.* So let's ask and imagine yet again and let His power work in us to set yet another record. Not for our glory, but for His and to be able to "serve up hope" to the needy in our community.

We have lots of tickets to sell and lots of preparation to do in the next few weeks. Vicksburg is a community of giving people...we just have to let them know that this is more than a "lunch", it is their opportunity to reach out a helping hand to those in dire circumstances and need in our community.

Tell them that **Hope is being served on October 12th and all through the year.**
