### Soup & Sandwich Luncheon – Are You Ready to Serve (Up Hope)?



It's September and our Soup & Sandwich event is fast approaching. We need full cooperation from all! Tina needs auction items, we need tickets sales, and baked goods. We must increase our SAWA funds. Our county needs us and we must step up to the job. We have working hands but to do our duty fully we need the CASH in hand. Our Soup & Sandwich goal this year

is \$15,000. We can do this, ladies -but we have to do it together.

My bakers- start now cooking cakes and freezing them. Go to "Dollar Tree" and buy the small tin oblong pans (2 for \$1). The capacity of three of these is equal to one regular oblong baking pan. One whole cake selling for \$10 to \$12, can now sell for \$12 to \$15 as mini-cakes. Many people can't eat a whole cake, but like a sample of several items. Think 1/2 cakes and 1/3 cakes for better sales. Remember to price your cakes and cookies to help our booth workers. (Anyone wishing recipes can contact Cappy. Copies of recipes also will be available at the September meeting).

We need to push our ticket sales. Remember your friends at church and the people you do business with. They don't have to buy in bulk. Remind them that it is a donation to the Salvation Army. If they have Luau Tickets, they can redeem/swap though Cherry. The Soup & Sandwich tickets are \$8 and they will get a \$2 credit toward our Bake Sale goodies, if desired.

Tina needs raffle items. Half the funds raised at this event are from the Silent Auction. Restaurant meals, artwork, household décor, and salon services (especially manicures, pedicures, and massages) are tops in bidding. If you know of new businesses, please check with Tina to see if they are assigned and then go ahead and approach them. Remind businesses that their donation can help to bring in new customers – while doing a great public service and getting a tax reduction.
