## From the President's Desk

The Vicksburg Chapter of the Salvation Army Women's Auxiliary was officially organized in 1976 with 30 women listed as charter members. In 2009, we have grown to 98 members. Throughout these 33 years, the members of SAWA have maintained the same focus – making a difference for good in our community.

The Salvation Army believes in "meeting the need at the point of need" and that is the goal of all fundraising and service efforts of the Women's Auxiliary.

Throughout the next few months, we are embarking on our biggest fundraising event AND our biggest service project. The October fundraiser is the 30<sup>th</sup> Annual Soup & Sandwich Luncheon. The Silent Auction (its 5<sup>th</sup> year) and Bake Sale are more recent additions. With the economy's decline, more and more funds are required to assist the less fortunate. The need will be especially evident during the Christmas season – meaning probably more "angels" to be provided for this year.

We are challenged then to meet this increasing need – both through fundraising and serving. In facing this challenge, I am reminded of a quote from Helen Keller, "Alone we can do so little, together we can do so much." The Bible instructs us along those same lines, in Romans and Corinthians, when the church is described as being composed of many parts, each with its own function, but all necessary to the functioning of the body.

We have 650 S&S tickets to sell (with 98 members, that's 6.6 tickets each). So the pressure is on all of us. But . . . "together we can do so much."

In order to continue the growth of the Silent Auction, we must obtain many, many donations, but – "together we can do so much."

650 servings of soup – that's a lot of pots and a lot of stirring.

650 sandwiches – that's a lot of pimento cheese & a lot of spreading.

650 people! – that's a lot of everything – but, "together we can do so much." . . . . . . . . Well, you get the message.

"Serving Up Hope" is the theme of our Soup & Sandwich Luncheon. As you go into the community, share with people the meaning of this phrase. Let them know that the contributions they make to the Salvation Army do indeed "serve up hope" to those in need in our community. (Stress too that all money raised by the SAWA is used right here for client services.)
